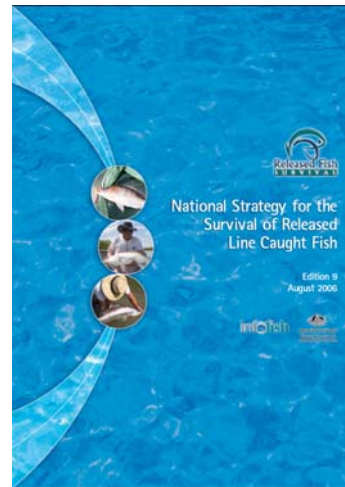


## Edition 9 of National Strategy now available

This is the most popular document on the website with over 800 downloads to end September 2006.

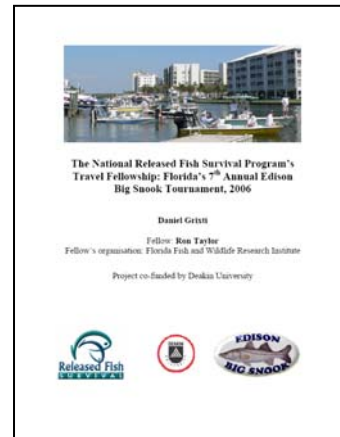
Edition 9 provides an update of survival rates from research, the research priorities from 2007/08 onwards and the latest information products.
