Infotag and Suntag Services Improved

Suntag has been on the web at www.info-fish.net for about two years now. The site has undergone its first major upgrade since that time although users will only notice subtle changes. Changes include:

Taggers can now access the tagging manual, tag grid maps and forms used to collect Suntag data from the site. The tagging manual available from the site is the master manual and will always have the latest documentation on aspects of tagging and data collection. Available in the future will be a complete copy of the manual once a review of the documentation has been completed next year.

Access to some areas on the site such as the Tag Grid maps is limited to members that are registered with us. This provides a secure method of maintaining our information. To access those areas you need to subscribe under Member's login.

For the first time there is a complete list of all Suntag awards and recipients available to taggers. We are aware of taggers that have not received advise of these. If you are on any of the lists but have not received anything please let us know. If you have never received the relevant certificate then let us know and we will forward it to you.

Suntag reports produced using Suntag data are now available from the website. The range of reports will gradually be expanded providing information on the over 385,000 fish tagged and 32,000 recaptures in the database as well as some of the other data that is now collected.

Copies of Suntag News are also available from the website including back copies for the past two years.
