

Fish have taken advantage of the very wet season and flooding to move to places they have not been able to get to for many years. Here are 3 fish that have all been at liberty for over 13 years. One moved upstream while the other 2 made their way downstream over the Somerset and Wivenhoe dam walls and down the Brisbane River to below Mt Crosby Weir. Note the very slow growth rate for K38704 which is typical of the larger fish. K32307 is the largest Bass recaptured to date.
