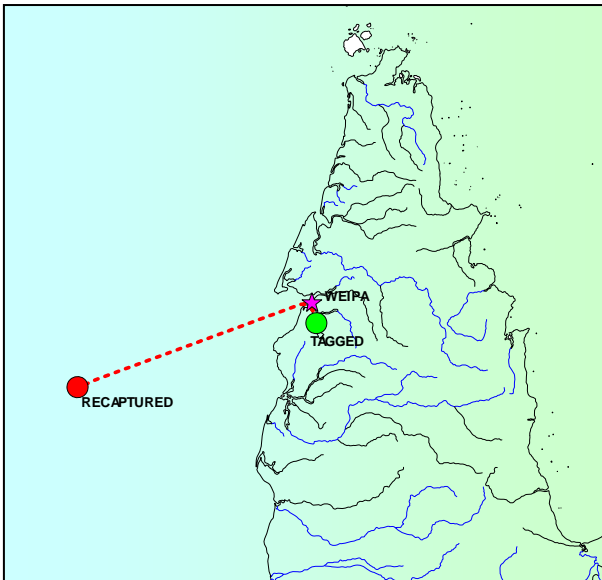




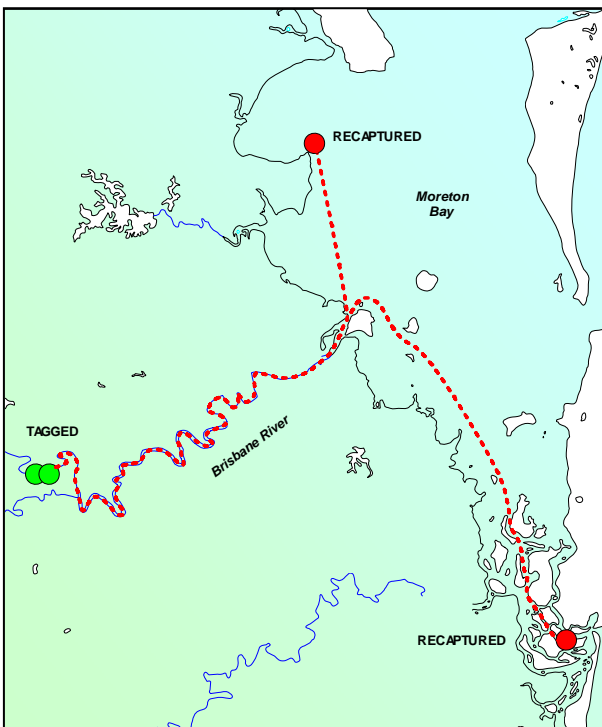

These fish were likely to have moved associated with spawning migration. Of interest is that the fish moved in different directions once leaving the river. The fish caught at Scarborough Reef was likely to have been heading to Caloundra. Most Bream in the bay north of the Brisbane River move north to spawn while most to the south move to the south. Brisbane River appears to be the dividing point where fish can move both ways.
